Louisiana Shrimp Association Commends the USITC Affirmative Decision "Frozen Warmwater Shrimp from Ecuador, India, Indonesia, and Vietnam Injure U.S. Industry"

(Larose, Louisiana) -The Louisiana Shrimp Association(LSA) commends the affirmative decision of the US International Trade Commission (USITC) in determining that the American Shrimp Industry has been injured due to imported shrimp. On November 19, 2024, the USITC determined that a U.S. industry is materially injured by reason of imports of frozen warmwater shrimp from Indonesia that the U.S. Department of Commerce has determined are sold in the United States at less than fair value and imports of frozen warmwater shrimp from Ecuador, India, and Vietnam that Commerce has determined are subsidized by the governments of Ecuador, India, and Vietnam.

Since the ITC'S determination was affirmative that the industry was being injured, the US Department of Commerce will issue countervailing duties on shrimp from Ecuador, India, and Vietnam. They will also issue an anti-dumping duty order on Indonesia. The full report will be issued January 6, 2024

We would like to thank the members of LSA for being so greatly dedicated to this association.
